### WHY THIS TOPIC MATTERS

Across Nigeria, many girls face fear, harassment, or discomfort in everyday places. These could be:

- On the way to school
- Inside a market or shop
- At a bus stop or in a keke
- Online — like group chats or comment sections
- Even in schools or places of worship

We want to understand these experiences. By collecting your voices, we can raise awareness, push for safer communities, and influence those who have the power to make change.
